St Mary's Treasures

The Marlene Carter Heritage Centre holds many treasures and relics, but you would never find our Reverend Joyce Polson OAM letting you call her either one! A very special morning tea was held for Reverend Joyce in the Heritage Centre in September last year. Some of Joyce's donated items, including her Medal of the Order of Australia were on display, along with her WA State Women's Cricket Team blazer and signed cricket bats.

Old and dear friends listened as Joyce recalled her days of joining the clergy, and retold tales of amusing goings-on at school assemblies! The twinkle in her eyes and wry sense of humour have not diminished, even

if her legendary spin bowling arm now needs the occasional help of a friend.

Reverend Joyce had been a Deaconess and assistant to Canon Lawrence William Riley, known as Bill, while he was at the Applecross Anglican Church, and later at St Mary's West Perth. She was great friends with his children, Tim and Geoff Riley AM, who both attended the Foundations' 35th Anniversary Dinner this year. The attendance of the grandsons of the School's founder, Bishop Charles Lawrence Riley CBE, at the event, brought great significance and meaning to the occasion. They also donated significant Riley family bibles, Bishop's seals, and memorabilia to the Archives Collection.

Traditions Old and New

As we begin St Mary's next Century of Discovery, we have not forgotten our heritage or traditions.

The School's Centenary Plaque was laid in the footpath of Colin Street in West Perth. The Year 3 girls, who visit St Mary's West Perth annually, now conduct rubbings of the plaque as part of the *Hands on our History* program.

Another new tradition stemming from the School's centenary is the White Chapel Service. The girls wear a white dress under their blazer, complete with white gloves and hat. They take part in a traditional chapel service, including readings from the King James version of the Bible. They later re-enact the Prefects' photo taken in 1965, when the girls first visited the Karrinyup site, in their formal white dresses and holding the School flag.

This year, the Old Girls' Association also introduced a special pin for current students whose mother, grandmother or great grandmother are Old Girls. New students will receive their pins at the start of every school year to proudly wear on their lapels.

One old tradition still going strong is the burying of time capsules. The Junior School Centenary Time Capsule and the Year 12 Centenary Time Capsule were both buried with precious mementos and treasures, ready for their unveiling in the future.

New Creative Arts and Design Centre

Art has always been a popular and well-taught subject at St Mary's, from the School's early days of nature walks with Miss Tothill, or technical drawing and painting classes with Margaret Saunders.

Not always housed in a specific studio space when the School was at West Perth, art classes were initially held in random classrooms or under a tree at the Karrinyup campus, before moving into the Art, Music and Drama Centre. With increasing participation and changing curricula, Music and Drama soon outgrew their spaces and moved to the Lady Wardle Performing Arts Centre and the Lady Treatt Centre for Music and Dance.

With the Visual Arts, Textile Technologies and Media Studies departments continuing to grow and expand, work has commenced for the new Creative Arts and Design Centre which will see all these departments housed in one creative hub.

This contemporary, light-filled centre will offer spacious studios, multimedia rooms and galleries designed to ignite a strong culture of student innovation, creativity, collaboration, and experimentation.





