St Mary's is home to a vibrant and diverse Music Department, providing students from Kindergarten to Year 12 with extensive opportunities to engage in music both in the classroom and through a broad cocurricular program including orchestras, choirs, bands, and other ensembles.

The department comprises approximately 30 peripatetic music staff, alongside 8 fulltime staff members, across the Junior and Senior Schools. All Junior School and Year 7 students receive timetabled music classes, with elective music classes available in Years 8 to 10 and as a WACE subject.

ROLE

This role involves teaching music in our Senior School, with the possibility of some Junior School classes. Teaching is focussed on Kodály-based classroom education, and includes active involvement in the St Mary's cocurricular music program, ideally within the String or Choral ensembles. Additionally, the role requires mentoring a vertical house group (*Link* class). A time allowance is provided for cocurricular activities.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Teaching and Learning

- Create an inclusive, supportive learning environment that encourages musical exploration and student growth, using diverse teaching strategies to meet individual needs and deepen musical understanding.
- Deliver engaging Kodály-based music lessons to develop students' musical skills across varying abilities.
- Teach music across both Senior and Junior Schools, maintaining a consistent Kodály approach.

CLASSROOM MUSIC TEACHER (Secondary)

- Engage in the cocurricular music program, including accompanying, conducting, or facilitating ensembles ideally within the String or Choral programs. These occur outside regular school hours.
- Support strategic partnerships with external music organisations and partner schools.
- Communicate effectively with students and parents, providing constructive feedback and support to foster musical progress.

Pastoral Care

- Act as Link class teacher, supporting the pastoral development of students and contributing to the overall wellbeing programs of the school.
- Actively participate in pastoral care and wellbeing programs and other cocurricular activities. Some cocurricular activities will occur outside normal school hours.
- Communicate with students, colleagues and parents/guardians in a respectful, clear, caring and professional manner.

Other duties

- Participate in school functions and events including but not limited to Speech Night, Parent Teacher evenings, school liturgical services.
- Carry out supervisory duties as required.
- Engage in professional reading and development as part of an expectation of continual professional learning.
- Participate in department meetings and whole staff meetings. Some of these may occur outside of normal school hours.
- Abide by the staff Code of Conduct and other School policies.
- Other duties as may be required.

- Expertise in Kodály-based classroom music teaching in, with experience designing and implement a Kodály programs in both Junior and Senior Schools contexts.
- Strong communication and organisational skills, committed to creating inclusive learning environments.
